



Bradford City Fire 1985: Tales of Heroism, Community and Resilience (upper Key Stage 2)

Main Purpose of the Resource:

To develop a greater understanding of the Bradford City Fire of 1985 and to create empathy for others, by looking at real stories of heroism.

Learning Objectives:

History	-To study an aspect of history that is significant in the locality.
English	-To retrieve, record and present information from non-fiction texts -To participate in discussions, presentations and role play, giving well-structured explanations. -To listen carefully and to ask relevant questions to extend understanding and knowledge.
PSHE	-To reflect on moral issues, using imagination, to understand other people's experiences. -To recognise the different risks in different situations and explore how actions can affect people.

Learning Outcomes:

By participating in the activities, **all children** should learn the details of the Bradford City Fire of 1985 and explore their idea of what a hero is.

By reading the texts, **most children** will develop a greater understanding of the people who helped in the fire, why they are significant and what actions create a hero.

By putting themselves the place of others, **some children** will understand how the event and the stories show Bradford's real heroism, resilience and morality.
